RUSH FIRE DISTRICT – NEWSLETTER INFO FOR - AUGUST/SEPTEMBER

FIRE DISTRICT: You are reminded that it is <u>your responsibility</u> to have access for emergency equipment onto your property. Our crews have had problems getting in with the ambulance and other equipment due to low branches and bushes, this slows our response and has damaged our vehicles. The lack of visible house numbering also remains a problem and is violating building codes.

WEST RUSH GENERATOR: We are spending \$7,200 for a 12 KW natural gas generator for station two at West Rush. The 10 KW we have there now is beyond repair.

2018 BUDGET: We are in the process of doing next year's budget. It is our goal to keep your tax rate at \$1.12 a thousand. The fire commissioners and Rush Fire Department membership is doing everything that we can to keep this rate as low possible.

BUILDING ADDITION: We had a local contractor who did the majority of our last project in 1998 addition look at what we need and he thinks we can get it done for around \$80.00 a square foot. We want to put all the water rescue and special operations equipment in one area. (4 WD – ATV and Boats w/ trailer) We need a bay high enough to raise the cabs on the larger truck to do maintenance so we don't have to do it outside in the cold and snow in the winter time. We need a larger secure equipment storage area. The boiler is way past its expected life span. We are looking at between 3,500 & 4,000 sq. foot. This should cost around \$300,000. We have the funds in a reserve account for this. When other area departments need more room they just built new stations that cost between 6 and 10 million \$\$\$. We not going to do that.

As you can see our VOLUNTEERS spent a lot of time doing additional training along with our normal Monday night drills and classes.

MEMBERSHIP: We have an explorer who is now an active firefighter and he is Josh Gretzinger. Christopher Hahn has moved to social membership. We are still looking for new members – CAN YOU HELP?

MUTUAL AID AMBULANCE: We have had to Mutual Aid 15 BLS (Basic Life Support) calls out of 95 calls for the ambulance since January 1st because of no crew. ALS (Advance Life Support – Paramedic) covered 70% of our calls that ALS was required, so crews for those were not an issue when we didn't have a crew. We had a First Responder on 90% of these calls.

We were very happy with the ride and midway contractor MIDWAY OF UTICA NY. The midway had several games and any kind of Carnival food you could wish for. They provided 5 adult rides, 6 kiddie rides. Our explorers and adult advisor Asst. Chief Jon Faugh handle all ticket sales. We get between 20% and 25% of the total ticket sales and last year we received \$4,700 from Midway Rides of Utica, NY. The band, Reporter played Saturday night and the Boy Scout Troop sold out of their famous BBQ chicken dinners.
