# RUSH FIRE DISTRICT, BOARD OF FIRE COMMISSIONERS

**Roll Call:** Chairman Robert Faugh called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m. followed by the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag.

**Present**: Commissioners Robert Faugh, Michael Terzo (7:38 pm), Lawrence Meston, Dale Sweet, Scott Goodman, Treasurer Robert Kuhls, and Secretary Colleen Statskey.

Representing the Rush Fire Department was Chief James McNeil, Assistant Chief Joseph Watlack.

Representing the Town of Rush was Councilman Gerry Kusse

**Absent:** Assistant Chief Jon Faugh and President Duane Fanning (working and illness)

**REPORT FROM THE TOWN:** Councilman Gerry Kusse reported road side clean up on Earth Day will be resurrected this spring. The Rush Riverside Refuge will have roof replacements done pending the weather. Commissioner Dale Sweet discussed the letter received from Supervisor Cathy Frank and Legislator Karla Boyce regarding the Industry School addition of new residents and new jobs available.

**APPROVAL OF MINUTES**: The Minutes of January 16, 2018, were approved.

A motion was made by Commissioner Lawrence Meston, seconded by Commissioner Dale Sweet and approved 4-0 to accept the Minutes of January 18, 2018, as written.

#### AREAS OF CONCERN:

**COMMUNICATIONS:** None.

FIRE MARSHAL: No report.

**NEW EQUIPMENT:** Chief James McNeil reported the gas meters are back on the trucks and all officers have been notified.

**TRAINING:** Commissioner Robert Faugh sent all members information from the US Fire Administration.

Assistant Chief Joseph Watlack has ice rescue scheduled for March 12 and 19. Air packs drill set up at Churchville. Commissioner Dale Sweet asked for an update status on Josh Eggleston. Chief McNeil reported behind on mandatory training, gear will not be returned until all mandatory training is completed. Josh Eggleston EMT paperwork will not be honored at this time.

Assistant Joseph Watlack reports any information he receives from the county is forwarded to all members.

HOUSE #1: Commissioner Michael Terzo working with Leo J. Roth regarding the roof leak. Chief James McNeil stated the front door would not unlock all the way. Chief McNeil had to readjust the lock and tighten up the screws. Commissioner Dale Sweet reported the Lifetime Assistance members arrived and eager to tour the facility. Commissioner Dale Sweet purchased new cleaning supplies and the Lifetime Assistance residents started with their cleaning duties. They will clean every Monday around 10:30 AM. Commissioner Dale Sweet talked with Larry Kaplan regarding the box that needs wiring. Commissioner Lawrence Meston will help Larry Kaplan. The septic tank will be taken care of when the weather permits this spring. Commissioner Michael Terzo reported difficulties with Spectrum Cable answering their telephone and returning his telephone calls. Commissioner Robert Faugh will obtain 3 cable boxes total for House #1 and House #2 from Spectrum Cable.

**HOUSE #2:** Commissioner Dale Sweet spoke with Larry Kaplan regarding the photo eye on the flagpole and will be replaced with an LED.

VEHICLE & EQUIPMENT MAINTENANCE: (Commissioner Michael Terzo arrived) Commissioner Robert Faugh reported 582 flood/spot lights were replaced. Commissioner Robert Faugh stated the 200 gallon a minute Honda pump was rebuilt by Assistant Chiefs and parts were ordered at a cost around \$70.00. The pressure washer was left outside in freezing temperature weather. Commissioner Robert Faugh brought the pressure washer inside, tested it and is working with no leaks. The 300 gallon a minute trash pump at House #2 was frozen and is now at House #1. Commissioner Dale Sweet reported 583 gas tank is leaking, raise the bed for the pond, spring work needs to be done and running boards replaced. Commissioner Robert Faugh will have quotes obtained by Har-Rob and Churchville Fire Equipment. Commissioner Robert Faugh will have Thruway Spring repair the shocks.

A motion made by Commissioner Dale Sweet, seconded by Commissioner Scott Goodman, and approved 5 to 0 to have a quote done by Har-Rob for 583. Commissioner Robert Faugh will take 583 to Thruway Spring to replace the shocks.

**SAFETY/OSHA**: Commissioner Robert Faugh sent a letter to Sheriff Baxter explaining complaints from members regarding sheriff cars at scenes leaving blinding flashing lights on. In the letter it was stated that Fire Apparatus is required to have a system when the parking brake is set all flashing headlights, white lights, etc. have to go out. The flashing lights are becoming a safety hazard. Captain Wagner at Zone B was notified a few months ago. Commissioner Robert Faugh stated in the letter that he is expecting a reply from Sheriff Baxter.

**EMS, 911, STREET DIRECTORY:** Commissioner Robert Faugh and Commissioner Scott Goodman reviewed the EMS calls report.

**INVENTORY, INSPECTION & INSPECTION DINNER**: Commissioner Dale Sweet and the Commissioners discussed the Time Warner cell phone bill. Commissioner Michael Terzo will have the 3 old chief cell phones and all truck cell phones will be out of service. One new cell phone will be purchased for the radio room. All tablets, tough books and 2 Verizon cards will remain active.

**LEGISLATION:** Commissioner Robert Faugh discussed the State Fire Chiefs are pushing the legislation to let fire departments bill insurance companies and Medicare.

**INSURANCE AND GROUP LIFE INSURANCE:** Treasurer Robert Kuhls and Commissioner Lawrence Meston reported the Crime Policy Renewal was obtained. The Employee Assistance Program was renewed. Commissioner Lawrence Meston and Treasurer Robert Kuhls would like the policies mailed out as hard copies, not sent out electronically.
